1. From your perspective, what process should we follow to secure a female Elder in WCPS?

Qualities of an Elder:

- Demeanor
- Female role model, rite to share stories, rites of passage for females,
- Training as a young women- who mentored the Elder? Teachings- brought up the old way
- Create a sense of belonging for all students
- Ability to work with a wide range of student ages
- Fluent in Cree language

Student input is important-FNMI Lead Teachers will gather this info.

• Recommendations going forward

Caution: Elder role shouldn't be advertised. Not true Elders are popping up- be cautious.

Tanya, Garry and Leanne volunteered to assist in discussing the role of an Elder in WCPS. FNMI Lead Teacher will connect with students and gain feedback into qualities students feel are important for an Elder to have. Date to be set in May to meet.
